Biographical / Historical

Richard D. Weigle was born in Northfield, Minnesota in 1912, and grew up in New Haven, Connecticut. After graduating from Yale University in 1931, he was a Yale-in-China bachelor from 1931 to 1933, teaching at Changsha in Hunan Province, China. He returned to China in 1935, and afterwards received a doctorate in diplomatic history from Yale University. He taught at Carleton College in Minnesota until leaving in 1942 to join the United States military. During World War II, Weigle served in the United States Army Air Force and the Chinese Army in India. After the war, Weigle was president of St. John's College in Annapolis, Maryland for thirty-one years. He died in Annapolis in 1992.

Content Description

The collection consists of material related to Richard Weigle's time as a Yale-in-China bachelor and his service in the United States Army Air Force and the Chinese Army in India during World War II. The collection also contains material related to Richard Weigle's father, Luther Weigle. Included in the collection are family genealogies, photographs and negatives of the Weigle family and Richard's time in Asia and Europe, clippings pertaining to Richard and Luther Weigle, travel journals documenting Richard's time in Europe and China, a Yale-in-China diary kept by Richard Weigle, Weigle family correspondence, a World War II scrapbook, and Richard Weigle oral histories.

The papers are arranged in three groupings: Early life, China and later years, and Luther Weigle.
