Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections as they are acquired, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This collection received a basic level of processing, including rehousing and minimal organization.

Maureen Stapleton

Maureen Stapleton (1925-2006) was an award-winning American actress. Born in Troy, New York, Stapleton acted in theater, television, and films. She won two Tony Awards, received a Best Supporting Actress Oscar for her work in *Reds* (1981), and earned an Emmy for *Among the Paths of Eden* (1968). Stapleton died in 2006.

Scope and Contents

The Maureen Stapleton Papers, which span from 1935 to 2006, contain extensive correspondence with actors, directors and authors including Elizabeth Taylor and Tennessee Williams. Also contains printed material, photographs of Stapleton and other actors, annotated scripts, and other papers by or relating to Maureen Stapleton's life and work.
