Biographical / Historical

Gus Hall (1910-2000) was an activist, politician, prominent member of the Communist Party of the United States (CPUSA), and one of the people arrested in the 1949-1958 Smith Act trials of Communist Party leaders. Hall was born Arvo Kusta Halberg in Minnesota. His parents were Finnish immigrants and active members of the CPUSA. Hall dropped out of school in the eighth grade to help his father support his family by working in lumber camps and decided to join the CPUSA during this time, citing his labor as a lumber worker as the reason. He was officially recruited by his father to join the CPUSA in 1927.

Hall traveled to the Soviet Union for the first time in 1931 because lumberjacks were in demand in the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, within the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR). From 1931 to 1933 he studied at the V.I. Lenin Institute in Moscow. His time in the USSR cemented Hall's relationship with the USSR government. Upon his return to the United States, he worked as a Communist and Unionist. He changed his name from Arvo Kusta Halberg to Gus Hall in 1935.

During World War II, Hall served in the United States Navy in Guam before returning to the United States mainland. In the postwar period, Hall's activity in the CPUSA increased, and he became a member of the CPUSA National Board. Hall's activity as a board member made him a target of the United States government and led to his being arrested and charged with treason, along with other prominent party members. In 1949, Hall was convicted under the Smith Act of conspiring to overthrow the United States government. Hall was sentenced to five years in prison, along with eleven other members of the CPUSA. Hall fled to Mexico and when captured was sentenced to an additional time in prison. He was released from prison in 1957.

Upon his release, Hall returned to his work in the CPUSA. He traveled extensively between the United States and the Soviet Union, as well as other Communist countries. He ran for president of the United States of America four times as a third party candidate, in 1972, 1976, 1980 and 1984.

Hall continued to work for the CPUSA after his unsuccessful bids for the United States presidency. He worked to promote the CPUSA as president of the party, and later, as the party's secretary general. He continued his work until his death in 2000.

Content Description

The Gus Hall Papers contain the professional papers of Gus Hall throughout his time as secretary-general and president of the Communist Party of the United States of America (CPUSA), as well as his personal correspondence to his family during his time in jail.

This collection includes Hall's correspondence from jail during the years 1950 to 1957, when he was incarcerated for violating the Smith Act. This correspondence contains both Hall's original handwritten manuscript correspondence, as well as later transcribed typescript copies. This correspondence does not contain any material relating to the Communist Party of the United States, as Hall was only permitted to

send letters of a personal nature during his incarceration. As a result, these letters are to his wife, Elizabeth Hall, and their two children, Barbara and Arvo.

The Communist Party of the United States series includes pamphlets, correspondence, administrative documents, memoranda, promotional material, reports, and photographs. These professional papers primarily document the administration and organization of the Communist Party of the United States between 1950 and 2000. The pamphlets are entirely relating to Communism, union organizing, or left-wing activities. These pamphlets are primarily in English, but some are in Russian or Spanish.

The Travel series primarily documents travel by Hall to Communist countries, primarily the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), but also Vietnam, China, Mongolia and Cuba. The travel material includes photographs of Hall with high-ranking Soviet party members, including Leonid Brezhnev and Mikhail Gorbachev. This travel is also documented with itineraries, invitations to prominent events, and awards given to Hall. The papers also contain medals, pins, and buttons that range from campaign buttons to medals of honor presented to Hall by various Communist governments.

Arrangement

The Gus Hall Papers are arranged in three series: I. Communist Party of the United States, 1900-2000. II. Jailtime Correspondence, 1951-1957. III. Travel, 1912-1996.

Collection Contents

I: Communist Party of the United States of America, 1906-2000

The Communist Party of the United States series consists of material related directly to the administration, promotion, and membership of the CPUSA. This includes correspondence, annual reports, photographs of prominent CPUSA members (including Hall's family), articles, essays, pamphlets, and other written work. There are also marketing and promotional materials.

Material in this series are organized in three groupings: history, correspondence, and pamphlets. Materials within each grouping are arranged chronologically.

II: Jailtime Correspondence, 1951-1957

The Jailtime Correspondence series documents Hall's time as a political prisoner under the Alien Registration Act, also known as the Smith Act. A majority of this material is letters from Hall to his wife, Elizabeth Hall, and children, Barbara and Arvo. These letters do not contain political material, as he was prohibited from sending anything that was not personal in nature. Also included are letters to Hall from the parole board detailing the terms of Hall's incarceration and parole. The typed letters are duplicates of the handwritten copies.

This series is arranged chronologically, which was also the original order that Hall maintained as his filing system.
