SUMMARY: The Herman Landon Vaill Papers contain Vaill family correspondence, and diaries, other writings, and financial records of clergyman and teacher Herman Landon Vaill. Most letters are from Vaill to his wife Flora Gold Vaill, 1818-1847, with smaller concentrations of letters to Vaill from Flora Gold Vaill, 1818-1846, and from his father Benjamin Vaill, 1819-1837. Most other correspondence, 1816-1869, is between Vaill and his children, siblings, and cousins, and among members of the related Vaill, Gold, and Dudley families. Vaill's correspondence concerns his work as a clergyman and teacher; relationships with family, colleagues, and students; and his association with the abolition, women's rights, and temperance movements. Family correspondence includes letters about the Foreign Mission School, Cornwall, Connecticut, responses of the Vaill and Gold families to marriages of Cherokee students John Ridge and Elias Boudinot to white women, and references to the upbringing of Boudinot's children following the deaths of their parents in 1836-1839.

Herman Landon Vaill (1794-1870) (Yale 1824 MA Hon)

Herman Landon Vaill, Congregationalist clergyman and teacher, was born in Litchfield, Connecticut, in 1794. In 1823 he married Flora Gold (1799-1883), of Cornwall, Connecticut. During the 1810s-1820s, Vaill was a teacher at schools in central Georgia and in Connecticut, including the Goshen Academy, Goshen, Connecticut; the Morris Academy, Morris, Connecticut, where his students included abolitionist John Brown, circa 1816; and the Foreign Mission School, Cornwall, Connecticut. Vaill was pastor of churches in East Haddam, East Lyme, and Torrington, Connecticut, 1820s-1830s, and in Seneca Falls, New York, 1840s. Following his retirement in the 1850s, Vaill lived in Litchfield, Connecticut, until his death in 1870.

Flora Gold Vaill (1799-1883)

Flora Gold Vaill (1799-1883) was a sister of Harriet Ruggles Gold Boudinot (1805-1836), who married Elias Boudinot (1802-1839) in 1826. Boudinot, a Cherokee political leader and editor of the Cherokee Phoenix, was a son of David Watie (1775-) and Susannah Charity Reese Watie (1784-1832) and a nephew of Major Ridge (approximately 1771-1839), political and military leaders of the Cherokee Nation. Elias Boudinot adopted the name of his benefactor Elias Stockton Boudinot, a New Jersey statesman and philanthropist. Boudinot's cousin John Ridge (1802-1839), a son of Major Ridge, married Sarah Bird Northrup Ridge (1804-1856) in 1824.

Foreign Mission School (Cornwall, Connecticut)

The Foreign Mission School, Cornwall, Connecticut, 1817-1826, was founded by the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions for the conversion and education of Native American men and indigenous men from other countries as Christian missionaries. Staff and supporters of the school included Herman Landon Vaill and other members of the Vaill and Gold families. Racist opposition to the marriages

of Cherokee students Elias Boudinot and John Ridge to white women led to controversy over the School's mission.

Scope and Contents

The Herman Landon Vaill Papers contain Vaill family correspondence, and diaries, other writings, and financial records of clergyman and teacher Herman Landon Vaill. Most other correspondence, 1816-1869, is between Vaill and his children, siblings, and cousins, and among members of the related Vaill, Gold, and Dudley families. Vaill's correspondence concerns his work as a clergyman and teacher; relationships with family, colleagues, and students; and his association with the abolition, women's rights, and temperance movements. Family correspondence includes letters about the Foreign Mission School, Cornwall, Connecticut, responses of the Vaill and Gold families to marriages of Cherokee students John Ridge and Elias Boudinot to white women, and references to the upbringing of Boudinot's children following the deaths of their parents in 1836-1839.

Diaries, 1819-1870, contain brief entries on Vaill's daily activities, and several series of daybooks, 1820-1870, list personal expenses, income, and accounts with creditors, with related notes. Diaries and daybooks contain occasional references to associates including Lyman Beecher, Joseph Harvey, Daniel Bourbon Brinsmade, John Brown, Mary Ann Day Brown, the Foreign Mission School, John Ridge, and Elias Boudinot.

Other writings by Vaill include business records on sales of iron stoves and cookware, 1848; notes on visits to district schools in Litchfield, Connecticut, including names of teachers and school committee members,

teacher salaries, and student attendance statistics, 1853-1854; and writings on theology and notes on the Bible, undated. A volume of financial records summarizes income, property, and expenses, 1825-1843, with annotations by Vaill family descendants, 1928.

The collection is accompanied by a box, or small trunk, with domed lid, hasp, and lock, probably made about 1820-1840 and likely of American manufacture. The box is covered with wallpaper, probably block printed, with a pattern containing a pedestal supporting a three-tiered fountain, a floral bouquet, and a striated arched form, suggesting a gazebo in a garden.
