Emery Huston

Following his graduation from Wabash College in 1913, Joseph Emery Huston (1891-1951) of Connorsville, Indiana, became an advertising and assistant sales manager of the Lexington-Howard Company, manufacturers of the Lexington automobile.

Huston married Nelle Ansted (1890-1974) in 1914. Ansted's father, Edward Willard Ansted (1852-1917), had acquired the Lexington Motor Company in 1913. Edward Ansted's son, Frank B. Ansted (1884-1933), served as President of the company with Emery Huston as Vice President.

Pikes Peak Auto Hill Climb

The first Pikes Peak Auto Hill Climb (later known as the Pikes Peak International Hill Climb or The Race to the Clouds) took place in 1916 to publicize American entrepreneur and philanthropist Spencer Penrose's creation of the Pikes Peak Highway in Colorado. The second race took place in 1920, following World War I.

Lexington Motor Company

The Lexington Motor Company was founded in Lexington, Kentucky, in 1909. The Lexington automobile was manufactured in Connorsville, Indiana, from 1910 to 1927. The company built two short-wheelbase race cars with Ansted engines for the 1920 Pikes Peak Hill Climb. The cars placed first and second with drivers Otto Loesche and Al Cline, respectively.

Scope and Contents
