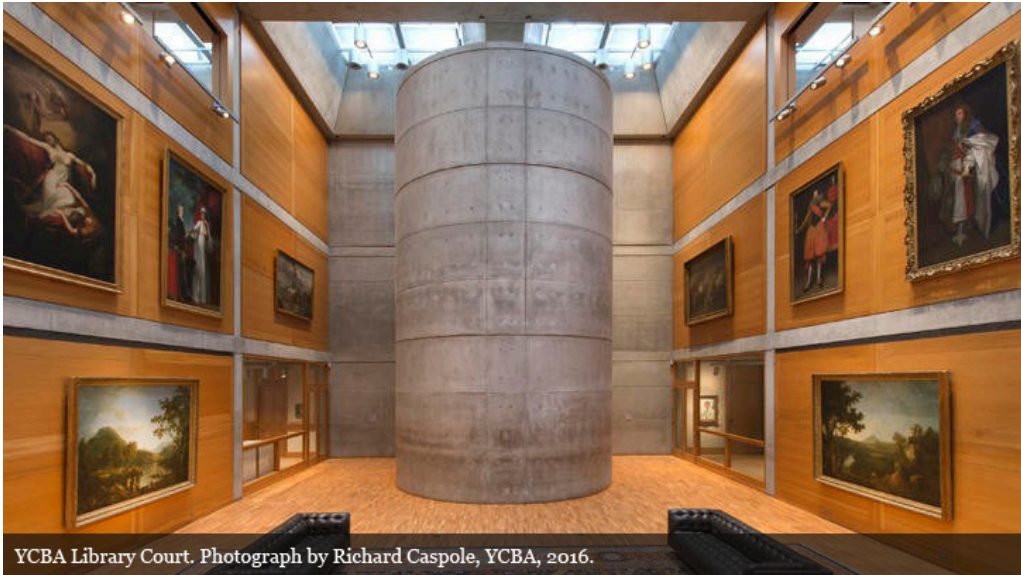

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## Biographical / Historical

Joseph Southall (1861-1944), painter and pacifist, was a key member of the Birmingham School of artists and an adherent of the arts and crafts movement. In 1901, he was a co-founder of the Society of Painters in Tempera.

Laurence William Hodson (1864-1933), of Compton Hall, Wolverhampton, was a brewer, art collector, and philanthropist. He was chairman of the Wolverhampton Art and Industrial Exhibition of 1902, and supporter of the Guild of Handicraft.

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## Scope and Contents

The collection comprises 14 autograph letters from Joseph Southall to Laurence Hodson; a catalog of paintings by Southall; and three additional lists of works by Southall. The correspondence reveals a growing friendship between Southall and Hodson and a shared desire to see the Birmingham Group of artists receive greater recognition beyond the West Midlands. This ambition is noted in a 1908 letter concerning an exhibition in London (folder 12): "... folks see a little of what we are driving at and what the effect of decorative art might be ... For the first time our Birmingham work has been put together without jarring elements to disturb it."

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## Arrangement

The collection is arranged into two series: I. Correspondence; II. Catalog and lists. The letters are arranged chronologically.

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b. 1, f. 1	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet</i> Southall writes that he been told by the New Gallery of Hodson's purchase of Beauty at the Fountain (now at the Cheltenham Art Gallery and Museum). b. 1, f. 4	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope</i> Southall hopes that a mirror has safely made it to Hodson, thanks him for purchasing his work and promises he will send a packet of drawings as well.  Genres / Formats: Correspondence	1899 October 27
b. 1, f. 5	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope</i> Southall writes that he has received a cheque from Hobson and thanks him for purchasing the mirror after it had been rejected by the Arts and Crafts group.  Genres / Formats: Correspondence	1899 November 27
b. 1, f. 6	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet</i> Southall sends a gift of a painted box to Hodson.  Genres / Formats: Correspondence	1899 December 27

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b. 1, f. 7	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope</i> Southall suggests times in which Hodson can come to see him and mentions an exhibition of Legros drawings he had enjoyed. b. 1, f. 8	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope</i> Southall writes about an exhibition at the New Gallery, in which he has been asked to take part. He requests that Hodson lend the Mirror and Beauty at the Fountain for it and asks for discretion regarding this information.  Genres / Formats: Correspondence	1901 March 8
b. 1, f. 9	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope</i> Southall suggests an exhibition of Birmingham work to be displayed in London.  Genres / Formats: Correspondence	1907 February 19
b. 1, f. 10	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet</i> Southall writes to tell Hodson he will not need the Mirror or Beauty at the Fountain for an exhibition he will be a part of in London but says he will send Hodson a private viewing ticket. b. 1, f. 11	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope + 1 photograph</i> Southall sends Hodson a photograph of his watercolour "The Schooner" in celebration of the New Year and thanks him for offering to lend The Mirror for an exhibition although it was not used in the end. b. 1, f. 12	Joseph Southall letter to Laurence Hodson <i>1 folded sheet + 1 envelope</i> Southall discusses frescoes and how he wished he had done more and continues on to discuss the success of the London show and its significance in exposing Birmingham work.
