### **Scope and Contents**

This record group contains relatively little material related to the Ikenberrys' work in China prior to their last stint in Shanghai following the second World War. Three times in their lives as missionaries in China, Olivia and Ernest Ikenberry had to evacuate because of dangerous war situations. First in 1927 when they were living in Taiyuan (Tai Yuan), the warlords began fighting for power in Shanxi (Shansi). The second time, in the winter of 1940, they had been living under Japanese occupation for three years in Ping Ting, Shanxi (Shansi). At this time the Ikenberrys burned all their letters, papers, and accounts to keep them out of the hands of the Japanese, afraid that some information could be used against the Chinese Christians. This collection does contain circular letters, writings, and photographs documenting the Ikenberrys' work in China as well as correspondence and other materials related to their work among Native Americans in the United States.
