Arrangement

The Davies/Scroggie Collection of White Pass and Yukon Documents and Ephemera is organized into two series: Commercial Documents and Ephemera and Transportation Documents and Ephemera.

Collection Contents

Series I: Commercial Documents and Ephemera, 1899-1946

The series contains various documents and ephemera, dating from 1899 to 1946, pertaining to commerce in Alaska and the Yukon Territory. The series is comprised of certificates, customs documents, bills, and receipts, which provide insight into daily life in the gold rush period (particularly in Skagway). The export and royalty certificates, in particular, chronicle the gold trade and its participants.

Series II: Transportation Documents and Ephemera, 1899-1947*5 linear feet (5 boxes)*

The series contains documents and ephemera, dating between 1899 and 1947, which record the development and operation of various companies in Alaska and the Yukon Territory. The materials explain how life and business could flourish despite travel and communications difficulties caused by the rugged terrain, the scattered settlements, and the severe weather. A substantial amount of material pertains to the various rail and river enterprises owned by the firm White Pass and Yukon Route and reveals how the company perceived its role in the territories and how it viewed its employees. The time rolls and distribution of labor books trace details such as the number of hours worked by employees, rate of hourly wages, and occupations, and thus constitute an important resource for labor history.

The series is organized into two subseries: Various Companies and White Pass and Yukon Route (Firm).
