Collection Contents

Series I: Boston Evening Transcript, Boston Morning Journal, 1885-1886

6 folders. Topics include rabies (hydrophobia), Pasteur, public health boards, side shows/menageries, smallpox, vaccines, food safety, prevention of cruelty to animals, disinfection of rags, influenza, medical treatments.

Series II: Chicago Tribune, 1885-1886

10 folders. Topics include rabies (hydrophobia), vaccines, smallpox, infection, cholera, quarantine, Pasteur, inoculation, contagious diseases, animal slaughterhouses/cruelty, stock diseases, advertisements (electromagnetic belt, laughing gas), yellow fever, diphtheria, grave robbing, animal circus.

Series III: Foreign newspapers, 1881–1888

4 folders. Topics include Pasteur; rabies (hydrophobia) cure and vaccine.

Series IV: Newark, New Jersey newspapers, 1885-1886

4 folders. Topics include rabies (hydrophobia), Pasteur, scarlet fever, rabies treatments, inoculation, treatment of dogs (catching, slaughter, dog pounds).

Series V: New York City and Brooklyn, 1882-1886

5 folders. Topics include Pasteur, rabies (hydrophobia), inoculation, vaccination, cures, experimentation.

Series VI: New York Herald, 1884-1896

5 folders. Topics include Pasteur, inoculation, experimentation, cures, rabies (hydrophobia), smallpox (Jenner), rabid dogs, Koch, vaccination, treatments.

Series VII: New York Sun, New York Telegram, 1885-1886

2 folders. Topics include Pasteur, rabies (hydrophobia), rabid dogs, treatments.

Series VIII: New York Times, 1858–1947

31 folders. Topics include yellow fever, dog laws, cures, rabies (hydrophobia), hydrophobia deaths, smallpox, vaccination, Koch (bateriology), tuberculosis, rabid dogs, inoculation, lymph (patients), diphtheria, antitoxine, cholera.

Series IX: New York Daily Tribune, 1882-1910

6 folders. Topics include tuberculosis, Koch, Pasteur, rabies (hydrophobia), disinfection of rags, rabid dogs, inoculation, diphtheria, antitoxine, smallpox, serum.

Series X: New York World, 1885–1888

3 folders. Topics include Pasteur, rabies (hydrophobia), experiments, cures, rabid dogs, diphtheria, inoculation, yellow fever.

Series XI: Miscellaneous USA, 1884-1895

9 folders. Topics include trichinosis, scarlet fever, diphtheria, Pasteur, rabies (hydrophobia), cures and innoculation.

Series XII: St. Louis Globe-Democrat, 1885–1886

19 folders. Topics include Pasteur, rabies (hydrophobia), inoculation, cholera, smallpox, yellow fever, vaccination, diphtheria, homeopathy, cures, rabid dogs, The Medical Society, trichinosis.
