Biographical / Historical

Gustaf Sobin was born November 15, 1935, in Boston, Massachusetts, and was educated at Brown University (A.B., 1958). Sobin was an American poet who made his home in Provence, France, for more than four decades up until his death. Sobin was heavily influenced by the work of his poetic peer and friend René Char. His body of work includes nearly thirty books of poetry, prose, and fiction, almost all of it reflecting his deep connection to the Provençal landscape, nature, history of the area and its geography. He married English painter Susannah Bott in 1968, with whom he had two children. Sobin died of pancreatic cancer, July 7, 2005, in Cavaillon, Vaucluse, France.
