Various papers relating to Ferrell's military service are also included. Biographical / Historical

J. L. (Joe Louis) Elmer Ferrell was born January 23, 1915 in Coolidge Texas, one of the at least nine children of Tom Ferrell (1876-1959) and Pearl Briscoe Ferrell (1883-1947). Ferrell worked various jobs as a driver and construction worker around Texas and Oklahoma before serving in the United States Navy during World War II. By 1943, Ferrell was working at Camp Mexia, the largest of Texas' prisoner of war camps that predominately held German Nazis. Ferrell married Hazel Pinkard (born on September 5, 1913) who wrote Ferrell letters detailing her social and academic life while she attended Tillotson College, a historic Black College in Austin, Texas. They married in 1939.

J. L. Ferrell died on April 15, 1986. Hazel Pinkard Ferrell died in June 1994.
