Biographical / Historical

John Freeman Levin was born in New York, New York, on January 1, 1944, to writer Jane Whitebread Levin and lawyer Lester M. Levin. In 1966, he graduated from Columbia University, joined the Marxist-Leninist Progressive Labor Party (PLP), and relocated to San Francisco, California. Also in 1966, Levin enrolled in an MFA program in writing at San Francisco State College and was appointed by the party as chair of the PL Club. At SF State, Levin helped restore the school's Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) chapter where he was active in the PLP's section of SDS known as the Worker Student Alliance (WSA).

During his time as a PLP activist, Levin led and contributed to flier and leaflet campaigns, strikes, teach-ins, forums, demonstrations, and recruitment efforts to promote the party, activities that included working with the SDS and other mass organizations. He was a key figure in a number of actions, 1966-circa 1973, primarily related to the anti-war student movement and the labor movement, including leading the Bay Area's Stop the Draft Week in 1967 and generating student support for the United Farm Workers (UFW) grape boycott, 1965-1970. Levin was also one of the leaders of the SF State Strike, 1968-1969, in support of the anti-racist demands of the Third World Liberation Front and Black Student Union. He was arrested in 1968 for his strike activities and served a prison sentence. As the PLP's West Coast student organizer, Levin's reach extended beyond the Bay Area to help establish and lead other SDS/PLP campus chapters in Utah and Hawaii, among other locations. Levin also wrote PLP materials and contributed to party

publications, including *PL: Progressive Labor* ("Power in the University," 1967, Vol. 6, No. 2) and *Challenge* ("S.F. State Rebellion," coauthored with Hari Dillon, circa 1968).

In his autobiographical account, "'On Strike! Shut It Down!'" Levin notes his disillusionment with internal party politics led to his dwindling participation in the PLP after the conclusion of the SF State Strike in 1969. He ultimately left the party in the 1970s and went on to establish a career as a playwright, novelist, and journalist. His published works include the novel *The Great Divide*, 1982 (coauthored with Frank M. Robinson); *Three Plays: Veracruz, Snowbirds, Big Money*, 2015; and "'On Strike! Shut It Down!'" in *You Say You Want a Revolution: SDS, PL, and Adventures in Building a Worker-Student Alliance*, 2019 (coedited with Earl Silbar).

Scope and Contents

This collection documents John Levin's political interests and activities with the Marxist-Leninist Progressive Labor Party (PLP)—primarily in California's San Francisco Bay Area from the mid-1960s to the mid-1970s. It also includes research related to Levin's later publication *You Say You Want a Revolution: SDS, PL, and Adventures in Building a Worker-Student Alliance*, 2019 (coedited with Earl Silbar). Levin's papers consist of his correspondence, notebooks, writing drafts, print publications, and collected third-party publications. The majority is composed of subject files relating to his research interests and political activities in the anti-Vietnam War student movement, labor movement, and Black liberation movement, including his participation in the SF State Strike, 1968-1969. Subject files include Levin's notes, news clippings, internal party records, and political print ephemera (e.g., fliers, leaflets, and pamphlets) primarily from the PLP as well as Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and other groups; they also include some photographs and SF State Strike-related digital A/V files. The remainder of the collection consists of internal party records, printed ephemera, and publications of the PLP, SDS, and additional political organizations and front groups.

This collection contains publications and printed ephemera with images of police brutality and violence, particularly in the context of Black liberation and the civil rights movement, as well as some instances of harmful and racist language.

Series I: John Levin papers, 1965-2019

Series I. John Levin papers, 1965-2019, consists of his correspondence, 1966-1970; notebooks, 1966-circa 1971; writing drafts, 1966-1969; a transcript of an oral history interview, 1984; publications, 1967-2019; and collected third-party publications, 1967-1977. The majority is comprised of subject files, 1965-2019, related to Levin's political activities (e.g., "SF State Strike," "Stop the Draft Week," "Lettuce Boycott," and a FOIA-requested copy of Levin's FBI surveillance file) and interests (e.g., "Black Liberation" and "Conscientious Objectors"). These files contain notes and news clippings as well as some correspondence, photographs, SF State Strike-related A/V files, and an SF State Strike reunion button. Subject files also include printed ephemera and internal party documents of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), and other organizations.

Organized in four subseries: Correspondence, 1966-1970; Writing, notebooks, and oral history, 1966-2019; Subject files, 1965-2019; and Collected publications, 1967-1977. Subseries are arranged chronologically except for subject files, which are arranged alphabetically by folder title.

This series also contains materials from PLP front group the May 2nd Movement (M2M) as well as local Bay-Area committees and initiatives (e.g., the Berkeley Anti-Draft Union and Mission Tenants' Union). It is primarily composed of printed ephemera (e.g., fliers, leaflets, and pamphlets) in addition to some publications, including the Canadian Labour Party's *The Worker*, 1977, and the Revolutionary Union's *The Red Papers*, 1965-1972.
