# Karen Halverson (born 1941)

Karen Halverson is a documentary landscape photographer. Born in Syracuse, New York, Halverson received a Bachelor of Arts from Stanford University and Masters of Arts from Brandeis University and Columbia University. In 1975, she made her first photographic project, which documented the Garment District in New York City. Much of her work documents the tension between the natural and cultural landscapes of the American West. She is the author of *Downstream: Encounters with the Colorado River* (University of California Press, 2008), which retraces the route of John Wesley Powell's expeditions and explores what contemporary Americans have made of the waterway.

# Scope and Contents

This collection includes portfolios of photographs and panoramic photographs created by Halverson that document the American West, 1987-2017.

Photographs of the Colorado River, 1994-1995, chronicle Halverson's exploration of the river from its tributaries, the Gunnison River and Green River, through its main length, including sites along the river in Wyoming, Colorado, Utah, Arizona, Nevada, California, and Sonora, Mexico.

Photographs of Basin & Range, 1987-2004, consists of images created by Halverson that explore a semiarid region of the western United States, also known as the Great Basin. This region extends from the Sierra Nevada on the west to the Wasatch Range on the east and from the Columbia Plateau in the north to the Mojave Desert in the south.

Mulholland: Nature and Culture in Los Angeles, 1991-2006, depicts views along Mulholland Highway and Mulholland Drive, a scenic road in Los Angeles County, California, that runs from California Highway 1 (Pacific Coast Highway) near Malibu along the crest of the Santa Monica Mountains to Hollywood.

Dakota Survey, 2011, depicts views of sites in North Dakota and South Dakota with an emphasis on lines and grids in the landscape.

Some Buildings in Marfa, 2017, documents buildings and sites at Marfa, Texas.

Most photographs in the collection are color inkjet prints with dimensions of 61.0 x 50.8 centimeters, and the panoramic prints have dimensions 40.6 x 121.9 centimeters.

Photographs of the Colorado River, 1994-1995, chronicle Halverson's exploration of the river from its tributaries, the Gunnison River and Green River, through its main length, including sites along the river in Wyoming, Colorado, Utah, Arizona, Nevada, California, and Sonora, Mexico. Many of the images were published in her work, *Downstream: Encounters with the Colorado River* (Berkeley: University of California Press, 2008). Images of canyons include the Canyon of Lodore, Goosenecks, Cataract Canyon, the Grand Canyon, and Black Canyon. Images of rock formations include the Sentinels in Canyonlands National Park. Images of dams include Fontenelle Dam, Glen Canyon Dam, Hoover Dam, Davis Dam, Parker Dam, Palo Verde Diversion Dam, Imperial Diversion Dam, and Morelos Dam. Images of reservoirs include Fontenelle Reservoir, Flaming Gorge Reservoir, Lake Powell, Lake Mead, Lake Mohave, and Lake Havasu, as well as a view of the natural lake, Grand Lake. Images of bridges across the Colorado River include Dewey Bridge, Navajo Bridge, and Silver Bridge.

Photographs of Basin & Range, 1987-2004, consists of images created by Halverson that explore a semiarid region of the western United States, also known as the Great Basin. This region extends from the Sierra Nevada on the west to the Wasatch Range on the east and from the Columbia Plateau in the north to the Mojave Desert in the south. Images from this region include sites in Arizona, California, Montana, Nevada, Utah, and Wyoming, as well as two views of Shiprock, New Mexico. Photographs of Arizona include Benson, Lake Powell, and Quartzite. Photographs of California include Alabama Hills, Desert Hot Springs, Independence, Keeler, Olancha, and Saline Valley, as well as several sites in Death Valley including Badwater, Death Valley Junction, Furnace Creek, and Teakettle Junction. Photographs of Montana include Dupuyer, Lennep, and an area near Heart Butte. Photographs of Nevada include the Elko, North Las Vegas, Pyramid Lake, Rhyolite, Tonopah, and Winnemucca. Photographs of Utah include Bonneville Salt Flats, Cathedral Valley in Capitol Reef National Park, Crescent Junction, Factory Butte, Hite, Great Salt Lake, Great Salt Lake Desert, Monument Valley, Price, and Valley of the Gods. Photographs of Wyoming include Cora, Dubois, Greybull, Pinedale, Reliance, Rock Springs, Thermopolis, Wind River, and Yellowstone National Park.

## Series III: Mulholland: Nature and Culture in Los Angeles, 1991-2006

#### 36.92 linear feet (10 boxes)

Mulholland: Nature and Culture in Los Angeles, 1991-2006, depicts views along Mulholland Highway and Mulholland Drive, a scenic road in Los Angeles County, California, that runs from California Highway 1 (Pacific Coast Highway) near Malibu along the crest of the Santa Monica Mountains to Hollywood. The route provides access, directly or en-route, to many of the regional parks in the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area. Locations depicted in the photographs are arranged sequentially from west to east. Identified communities include Beverly Glen, Calabasas Highlands, and Universal City, as well as a view above the Hollywood Bowl. Images of canyons or their vicinity include Laurel Canyon, Fryman Canyon, and Runyon Canyon. Images of reservoirs include Encino Reservoir, Stone Canyon Reservoir, and Hollywood Reservoir. Many of the photographs show the scenic road near or at intersections with other roads.

### Series IV: Dakota Survey, 2011

#### 2.33 linear feet (1 box)

Dakota Survey, 2011, depicts views of sites in North Dakota and South Dakota with an emphasis on lines and grids in the landscape. Identified locations in North Dakota include Dickinson, Edmore, Garrison, Grace City, Grafton, Max, Rugby, Sentinel Butte, and Williston. Identified locations in South Dakota include Bowdle, Flasher, Kadoka, Leola, Newell, Onida, and Scenic. The photographs show agricultural fields, road intersections, and structures, including an abandoned drive-in, fences, and windmills. A journal by Halverson accompanies the photographs with contents that span July 11 to August 5, 2011, and describes sites and her compositing of the images.

The images are printed as color inkjet prints on Canson Platine Fibre Rag Paper, 20 x 24 inches (51 x 61 centimeters). The prints are titled with the location of the image. The collection comprises an edition numbered two of ten.

In an artist's statement that accompanied the collection upon acquisition in 2016, Halverson describes the work:

In the summer of 2011, without itinerary or preconception, I drove to the Dakotas. I knew that, by and large, Dakota vistas would be broad and flat, making for a straight horizon line. But, heading west from Grand Forks, I was interested to find how strongly I experienced the land as a grid. Roads run in straight lines, north / south or east / west. Property lines and rows of trees known as shelterbelts do the same. This arrangement reflects the Homestead Act, signed into law by President Lincoln in 1862. Making use of geographical surveys, the law granted sections of land to settlers pledged to "improve" them. Euro-Americans were displacing Native Americans. Cultivated crops would replace native prairie grasses.

I had seen the grid from the air, but had not before experienced the geometry of the Plains on the ground. I chose the square photographic format, as an expression of the geometry I saw before me. The landscape presented a pattern, based on flat terrain and especially on land use. I see the Dakota Survey images as landscape sections, emphasizing the lines and forms that nature and human history have created.

## Series V: Some Buildings in Marfa, 2017

Some Buildings in Marfa, 2017, documents buildings and sites at Marfa, Texas.

The images are printed as color inkjet prints on Canson Platine Fibre Rag Paper,  $20 \times 24$  inches ( $51 \times 61$  centimeters). The prints are titled with the location of the image. The collection comprises an edition numbered three of twelve.

In an artist's statement that accompanied the collection upon acquisition in 2016, Halverson describes the work: Marfa is a:ranching town in the high desert of West Texas that remarkably, is also a center for minimalist art, drawing visitors from around the world. That was enough of an anomaly to make me hit the road. Setting out from a rented Airstream my first morning in Marfa, I saw that the town is a combination of slick and ramshackle. Hip art galleries and restaurants are mixed in among adobe structures serving ranchers, abandoned industrial buildings, modest sheds and bungalows. Like most visitors, I went to see the work of Donald Judd, the artist who settled in Marfa in 1971 and who is responsible for its latest incarnation as an art destination. Judd's own work paintings, sculpture, and design - favored geometry, rectangles, cubes, straight lines. He loved architecture, books, furniture, lighting :fixtures, all things beautiful, well designed, and functional. During the 20 years or so that Judd was in Marfa, he bought up many 1930s buildings and repurposed them - for his personal use and as exhibition space for his work and that of his fellow artists. Influenced by Judd, like-minded folks came to Marfa from urban centers and left their mark on the town. Now, ranchers and other old-timers live and work alongside artists, gallerists, and tourists. Judd's vision got to me. I saw both formal beauty and historical significance in Marfa's architecture, not just in vintage gas stations made into white box galleries, but also in modest and often run-down buildings. These photographs document Marfa's architecture and, in so doing, allude to its history. Back home, as I look at the photographs, I realize that it wasn't just Judd who was with me in Marfa, informing my process. Walker Evans and Ed Ruscha were there too.
