Processing Information

This collection received a basic level of processing, including in some instances rehousing and minimal organization, when it arrived at the library. Each acquisition is described separately in the contents list below, identified as a unique grouping and titled according to year of acquisition.

As a rule, descriptive information found in the Collection Contents section is drawn in large part from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

This finding aid may be updated periodically to account for new acquisitions to the collection and/or revisions in arrangement and description.

Russell Lynes (1910-1991)

Russell Lynes, born Joseph Russell Lynes, Jr. on 2 December 1910 in Great Barrington, Massachusetts, was an American art historian, photographer, author and managing editor of *Harper's* magazine. Lynes may be best remembered for his satirical commentary on American tastes and mores. In early works such as *Highbrow, Lowbrow, Middlebrow* (1949), *Snobs* (1950), and *The Tastemakers* (1954), Lynes mocked what he considered to be Americans' questionable preferences in art and architecture. Other works include *Guests* (1951), *The Domesticated Americans* (1963), and *The Art-Makers of Nineteenth Century America* (1970). Lynes died on 14 September 1991 in New York City.
