SUMMARY: The papers consist of writings, a scrapbook, an interview, and correspondence by and relating to the American poet and prose writer Oliver Hale. Writings include autograph manuscript and typescript drafts of poems and other writings. The scrapbook contains clippings of Hale's printed poems from publications. The typescript interview transcript, titled "The Poet and His Wife," is an interview with Hale and his wife, Esther, by Edward R. Murrow for the radio program "This I Believe." Correspondence includes acceptance letters from publishers to Hale.

Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

The collection received preliminary processing at the time of acquisition. Further organization, rehousing, and description were carried out in 2013.

The collection is comprised of material formerly classed as: Uncat ZA MS 507, Uncat ZA MS 512, Uncat ZA MS 518, Uncat ZA MS 534, Uncat ZA MS 552, Uncat ZA File 391, and Uncat ZA File 398. Various acquisitions associated with the collection have not been merged and organized as a whole. Each acquisition is described separately in the contents list below, according to month and year of acquisition.

Information included in the Description of Papers note and Collection Contents section is drawn from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during basic processing.

This finding aid may be updated periodically to account for new acquisitions to the collection and/or revisions in arrangement and description.

Oliver Hale (1897-1984)

Oliver Hale was the pen name for poetry and prose writer Oscar Hirschmann. He was born in New York City on August 2, 1897. In 1922, he married Esther Bloom, a graphologist, who was also from New York City. Hale died in California on January 30, 1984.

Scope and Contents

The papers consist of writings, a scrapbook, a transcript of an interview, and correspondence by and relating to the American poet and prose writer Oliver Hale. Writings include manuscript and typescript drafts of poems and other writings. The scrapbook contains clippings of Hale's printed poems from various publications. The interview titled "The Poet and His Wife," was conducted with Hale and his wife by

Edward R. Murrow for the radio program "This I Believe." Correspondence includes acceptance letters from various publishers to Hale.
