Processing Information

This collection received a basic level of processing, including in some instances rehousing and minimal organization, when it arrived at the library. During baseline processing of the collection in 2013, materials were organized with respect to provenance in the foure series identified below.

Sara Teasdale (1894-1932)

The American poet Sara Teasdale was born 8 August 1884 in Saint Louis, Missouri and home-schooled until she was nine. While living in the Midwest, she also traveled to Chicago, where she became part of the circle surrounding *Poetry* magazine and Harriet Monroe. Teasdale's first book, *Sonnets to Duse and Other Poems*, came out in 1907. Other works followed, including *Helen of Troy and Other Poems* (1911) and *Rivers to the Sea* (1915). After moving to New York City with her husband in 1916, she won the Columbia University Poetry Society Prize and the Poetry Society of America Prize for *Love Songs* (1917). She published three additional volumes of poetry during her lifetime, *Flame and Shadow* (1920), *Dark of the Moon* (1926), and *Stars To-night* (1930). Teasdale died 28 January 1933 in New York City and her final collection, *Strange Victory*, appeared posthumously that same year.

There are also materials and notes removed from volumes in Teasdale's library, as well as correspondence and loose notes.
