Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This collection received a basic level of processing in 2014, including rehousing and minimal organization. Various acquisitions associated with the collection have not been merged and organized as a whole. Each acquisition is described separately in the contents list below, identified by a unique call number and titled according to month and year of acquisition.

Information included in the Description of Papers note and Collection Contents section is drawn from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

Henry James (1843-1916)

Henry James (1843-1916), American writer.

Scope and Contents

The Henry James Collection is comprised of correspondence, writings, personal papers, and printed material by and about the American author Henry James.

The majority of correspondence consists of outgoing letters sent from James to recipients, most notably his literary agent James B. Pinker, author William Edward Norris, and publishers. The collection also includes correspondence between James B. Pinker and James' nephew, Henry James, and sister-in-law, Alice Howe Gibbens James.

Autograph manuscripts and proofs provide insight into James' creative process. James' autograph manuscript, corrected, for "The Pension Beaurepas" can be found in the collection; the Beinecke Library acquired pages 1-13 in 1951 and pages 14-169 in 1982. Pages 1-13 of "The Pension Beaurepas" were bound with an autograph manuscript of *The Europeans* before they arrived at the Beinecke Library and they have not been separated. James' work on "New England: An Autumn Impression" can be traced from autograph manuscript drafts and corrected galley proofs to the final printed version. Printed material includes the published versions of James' writings, including "New England: An Autumn Impression," as well as scholarship about James.

Personal papers include a photograph of James with Mrs. Humphry Ward and a cancelled check received by James from Ticknor and Fields.

Arrangement

Organized into four groupings: 1910-1959 Acquisitions, 1982 Acquisition, 1992 Acquisition, and Printed Material.

Collection Contents 1: 1910-1959 Acquisitions

Contains correspondence and writings. Correspondence is largely comprised of James' outgoing letters, most notably to James B. Pinker, William Edward Norris, and incoming letters from publishers. Letters between James' relatives and James B. Pinker can also be found in the Correspondence series. The Writings series includes autograph manuscripts, typescripts, and proofs, which provide insight into James' creative process, particularly at the end of his career. The first thirteen pages of James' "The Pension Beaurepas," which have been bound with *The Europeans*, is located in the Writings series. The remaining pages of "The Pension Beaurepas" can be found in the 1982 Acquisition.
