Biographical / Historical

Lee De Forest was born in Council Bluffs, Iowa, on August 26, 1873. He was a graduate of the Sheffield Scientific School at Yale University in 1896 and received a Ph.D. from Yale in 1899. He was an important contributor in the development of wireless telegraphy in the United States. He started multiple radio broadcasting companies and patented 300 inventions in his lifetime. In 1904, he was awarded the gold medal at the World's Fair in St. Louis, Missouri. He died on June 30, 1961.

Scope and Contents

The Lee De Forest Papers contain a small amount of correspondence. Most of it is letters from De Forest and his wife Marie Mosquini to Mrs. Jessica (Wallace) Millar, De Forest's "first love," as described in Chapter 8 of his autobiography, *Father of Radio*. There is also correspondence with a few other friends, and several Yale University letters concerning a testimonial dinner and bust of De Forest.

Over two thirds of the collection consists of writings by De Forest. Included are two versions of his autobiography, as well as a copy of the published volume. Also in the collection are a number of newspaper clippings about De Forest and several miscellaneous items.
