The scrapbooks were dismantled. Pages were removed from their binders and placed in folders, maintaining the original order of contents.

Biographical / Historical

Alfred Carlton Gilbert was born on February 15, 1884, in Salem, Oregon. He attended Pacific University and graduated from the Yale Medical School in 1909. The same year Gilbert founded the Mysto Manufacturing Company, producer of magic sets. In 1916, he changed the name to A. C. Gilbert Company and expanded his line, the best known toys being the Erector and chemistry sets, and American Flyer trains. In addition to his business accomplishments, Gilbert was known as a great athlete. He was world's champion and Olympic first-place pole vaulter in 1908, the first man ever to top thirteen feet. He died on January 24, 1961, in Boston.

Scrapbooks b. 1 Volume I: clippings, letters, and endorsements tracing Gilbert's athletic career, culminating in his participation in the 1908 Olympic Games as a pole vaulter winning the Gold Medal with Ernie Cook; accounts of his interest in magic arts and his performances as an amateur magician. b. 2 Volume II: clippings, letters, and photographs which chronicle Gilbert's career as a manufacturer, first as President of the Mysto Manufacturing Company of New Haven and later as founder and President of the A. C. Gilbert Company, producer of Erector sets and American Flyer scale-model electric trains; additional topics are the development of Yale athletics and Gilbert's interest in the professional breeding of shepherd dogs. Volume III: clippings, letters, and photographs relating to the A. C. Gilbert Company, Yale b. 3 athletics, Gilbert's hunting expeditions and leisure activities; the levelling of Erector Tower, a local New Haven landmark; obituaries of Gilbert and his son.
