Administrative Information

Immediate Source of Acquisition

The Yale Bookplate Collection was formerly housed in Sterling Memorial Library, Room 608. The collection was incorporated into the Arts of the Book Collection in 1984 and then moved to the Seeley G. Mudd Library in 1990. In 2011 it was transferred to the Robert B. Haas Family Arts Library.

Processing Information

The collection was originally housed in two boxes labeled "English Institutions." Also, the series divisions are based on the original categories assigned to the collection.

Scope and Contents

The collection comprises mostly 18th- and 19th-century bookplates from a variety of British institutions, including libraries, social organizations, military organizations, schools and colleges as well as businesses.

Arrangement

Organized into ten series: I. Parochial and Ecclesiastical Libraries. II. Circulating and Public Libraries. III. Clubs and Other Social Organizations. IV. Military Organizations. V. Schools and Colleges. VI. Premiums. VII. Universal Bookplates. VIII. Unidentified Bookplates. IX. Dr. John S. Pearson Collection of Bookplates from British Institutions.

Arranged alphabetically by the name of the institution. Whenever multiple bookplates from different organizations are affixed to the same mount, these are filed at the end of the series in a "Miscellaneous" folder or folders. Some of the miscellaneous items are duplicates of those appearing earlier in the series, whereas others are new to the series.

This series includes bookplates from a variety of parochial and ecclesiastical libraries.

Series IV: Military Organizations

This series includes bookplates from a variety of military organizations.

Series V: Schools and Colleges

This series includes bookplates from a variety of schools and colleges, ranging from grammar school to university.

Series VI: Premiums

This series includes prize bookplates – also known as premiums. Schools often presented students with books as a reward; starting in the 18th century, these books typically included a bookplate inscribed with the name of the student and the subject or other reason for recognition.
