Biographical / Historical

Harry Wythe Selden (1915-2003) was a Virginia farmer and John Birch Society member. Selden was born in Virginia on December 21, 1915 and worked on his family's dairy farm in Mathews County, Virginia (near Hampton) until 1947, when he moved to the Mechanicsville, Virginia area to farm. He returned to Hampton in 1991. Selden was a lifetime member of the John Birch Society and served as its state coordinator and official spokesman. He was a frequent writer of letters to newspaper editorial pages and an active teacher and officer in local churches. Selden married twice and had two daughters and four step-children. He died in 2003.

Scope and Contents

The collection comprises pamphlets, newsletters, and other materials collected by Harry W. Selden and concerning conservative and right-wing politics and activism from the 1950s to the 1980s. Materials include newsletters, pamphlets, mass mailings, flyers, press clippings and photocopies, correspondence, and other printed and published materials. The material covers a wide range of topics, including the United Nations, disarmament, anti-communism, and Republican and conservative politics, and represents a large number of right-wing organizations. The collection also includes pamphlets and flyers for political candidates, primarily Republicans, along with a small number of newsletters and pamphlets from left-wing organizations. Some materials have handwritten notes and underlining by an unidentified author, possibly Selden. The collection also includes a partial inventory, possibly prepared in the 2010s.

Arrangement

The papers are arranged in five series: I. Pamphlets, newsletters, and other materials, circa 1950s-circa 1980s. II. Subject files, circa 1950s-circa 1980s. III. Correspondence, 1968-1969. IV. News clippings and reprints, 1959-1975. V. Ephemera, circa 1960s-circa 2010s.

Collection Contents

Series I: Pamphlets, newsletters, and other materials, 1952-1984

This series consists of pamphlets, newsletters, mass mailings, flyers, and other printed matter related to right-wing politics and activism. Materials cover a wide range of topics and represent a large number of organizations and publications. Also included are pamphlets and campaign materials for and against various political candidates, mostly Republicans. Materials also include reprints of speeches and bills from the Congressional Record, along with a small number of publications from left-wing organizations and political candidates.

Series II: Subject files, 1958-1977

This series consists of pamphlets, newsletters, mass mailings, and other printed and published materials, sorted into subject files. Some subject groupings were in folders when received. Others were grouped together physically but not foldered; these were separated and foldered during processing.

Series III: Correspondence, 1968-1969

This series consists of a small amount of correspondence, primarily drafts or copies of letters to the editorial page of local newspapers, sent by Selden or others. In some cases, a newspaper clipping of the published letter is attached. Some similar correspondence can be found in the Sensitivity Training subject file in Series II.

Correspondence was mixed with other loose materials and was separated and arranged during processing. Series III is arranged chronologically.

Series IV: News clippings and reprints, 1959-1975

This series consists of a small number of newspaper and magazine clippings and reprints. Materials relate to a variety of topics, including national security, law enforcement, and right-wing politics and organizations.

Clippings were interfiled with other loose materials, and were separated during processing.

Series V: Ephemera, circa 1960s-circa 2010s

This series consists of a cardboard sign and a partial collection inventory. The cardboard sign (or poster) advertises a Carl McIntire speaking event in Colonial Heights, Virginia. The sign is incomplete; it has been cut into a smaller size, apparently for use as a file divider. The partial collection inventory appears to have been created in the 2010s, possibly by a manuscript dealer.
