Scope and Contents

This finding aid encompasses accessions of single manuscripts and small groups of manuscripts and other papers, by or pertaining to Oscar Wilde, which the library has chosen to group and list as an artificial collection. Materials incorporated into the collection prior to June 1997 have been organized into three series. The first series consists of items from the bequest of the estate of Katherine Dreier, principally letters removed from books (cataloged separately). The second series contains items given as a group by Abel Cary Thomas, mainly letters written by Wilde towards the end of his life. The third series, Additional Materials, contains two letters and several manuscripts, including notes by Wilde on his travels in France and Spain, and a draft of his "Phrases and Philosophies for the use of the young."
