Scope and Contents

This finding aid encompasses accessions of single manuscripts and small groups of manuscripts and other papers, by or pertaining to Chauncey Brewster Tinker, acquired by the library from a variety of sources. Materials incorporated into the collection prior to July 1998 have been organized into three series. <u>Series I</u>, <u>Mr. and Mrs. Gordon S. Haight Gift</u>, contains letters from Tinker to members of the Haight and Nettleton families, and one clipping of an obituary of Tinker. <u>Series II, Robert F. Metzdorf Gift</u>, contains articles and other writings by Tinker and others. <u>Series III, Materials from Other Sources</u>, contains letters, writings and other papers by and about Tinker.
