### John Daniel Wild (1902-1972)

John Daniel Wild, American philosopher, was born in Chicago, Illinois. He received his B.A. from the University of Chicago and his M.A. from Harvard University. He completed his Ph.D at the University of Chicago in 1926. After teaching for one year at the University of Michigan, Wild joined the Harvard faculty and taught there until 1961. In that year he became chair of the philosophy department at Northwestern University, then a leading center for the study of Phenomenology. He left Northwestern to join the Yale faculty in 1963; his final academic position was with the University of Florida.

His works included *Plato's Theory of Man* (1946); *Plato's Modern Enemies and the Theory of Natural Law*(1953); *The Challenge of Existentialism* (1955); and *The Radical Empiricism of William James* (1969). Wild was also one of the founders of the Society for Phenomenology and Existential Philosophy.

#### Scope and Contents

The collection contains writings, lecture notes, syllabi, research notes and notebooks and other materials documenting the scholarly career of American philosopher John Daniel Wild. In particular, the papers concern Wild's work on aspects of Phenomenology and Existentialism during the last decades of his career.

#### Arrangement

Organized in two groupings: I. 1974 Acquisition, 1943-1974; II. 2004 Acquisition, 1934-1972.

Material within this collection has been organized by acquisition reflecting the fact that the collection has been acquired in increments over time. Researchers should note that material within each acquisition overlaps with/or relates to material found in other acquisitions. For instance, writings and lecture notes can be found in both groupings. In order to locate all relevant material within this collection, researchers will need to consult each acquisition described in the Collection Contents section.

Researchers should also note that similar material can be arranged differently in each acquisition, depending on how the material was organized when it was received by the library.
